# HOLSWORTHY WALK AND TALK BY

The beginning of a new year allows us to look forward to lots more walking and enjoyment. We have had some interesting new walks recently which will be repeated for those who missed them the first time around and for those who would like to do them again. Sometimes we reverse the route and it is always surprising how many different perspectives we notice.

Prior to Christmas we walked at Highampton on a fresh, frosty day. Although the roads were clear the photo looks as though we were on an arctic expedition instead of a grass field in Devon. The following week we walked the Multi Use Trail in Bude which, only days earlier, had been completely submerged by flood water thanks to Storm Bert. Although we do try to walk whatever the weather, should conditions be felt to be dangerous we would not go ahead and would notify our members accordingly. Information would also be posted on our website.

In April we will be celebrating the 20th anniversary of Holsworthy Walk and Talk (formerly Walking for Health). Prior to 2005 David Arney had organised some 'practice' walks to encourage those participants to train as Walk Leaders and Back Markers. David had previously met Michael Heryet who still runs Bude Walk and Talk and who, at that time, was a Walk Leader Trainer. Michael trained six people back then,, two of whom are still walk leading and back marking with us on a regular basis.

The first walk which David Arney led began in the Manor Car Park, Holsworthy, heading over the Viaduct and out to Rydon. We propose repeating that walk in April and are keen for anyone who was either on that walk in 2005 or knows of anyone who was to get in touch and hopefully join us in our celebrations.

If you would like to join us, we walk on Mondays and Fridays. All walks start at 10.30 am and are **FREE**. Membership forms are available from our Volunteer Walk Leaders prior to the start of the walk. # **EVELYN'S WALK**

It was debatable whether the walk would go ahead as planned on Monday 9th December given that Storm Darragh had been raging over the weekend. We met in Bradworthy Square which was a hive of activity with the Christmas decorations going up. We turned left by H.J. Wicketts and followed the lane which took us past the School on our right. At the bottom of the hill, we con-



templated the name of the river which we crossed. It wouldn't come to me which was really annoying! The water level was much higher than when we last walked this way in July'23. We strolled up the hill through the beautiful avenue of trees admiring the far reaching views to the left. We followed the footpath sign which took us along the drive towards Berridon Farm. As most of the leaves had fallen, we had an opportunity to admire the wooden chalets in the field on our right. It must be a very tranquil environment for visitors but there wasn't any evidence of them in December. We followed the footpath sign which took us through a wooden gate on our right and across a beautifully kept field. The route is cleverly marked with a couple of strategically placed granite gate posts. We went through a couple of self-closing galvanised gates at the far side of the field. We turned right and entered a large field that would normally be grazed by cattle during the summer months. We crossed the wooden footbridge and again we contemplated the name of the river which we crossed. It was right on the tip of my tongue but annoyingly, it still wouldn't come to me! When we reached the lane, we turned right and then turned right again which brought us back to The Square. This is such a nice circular walk of approx. 2.3 miles and we



were all pleased that we had made the effort. Oh yes, when I got home the name came to me..... River Waldon.

This was the last walk for the year and there isn't one planned for January. I would like to take the opportunity to thank everyone for their company over the last twelve months. I must also thank the land owners who have very kindly given us permission to park on their land. This enables us to walk routes that would otherwise be awkward due to a lack of suitable parking. I am so grateful to the P3 volunteers who are usually associated with our Parish Councils as they check our local PROWs for accessibility and report back to DCC if there are any problems.
